

## Families Newsletter for Nursery- Summer Term 1

Next half term we will start to focus on our core story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar.' You can see overleaf for a selection of activities we will be learning in nursery and how you can help at home.



We will continue to learn the action to a new Makaton sign and revisit the signs we have already learned. You can help practise these signs at home too.

Each week you will find a new sign displayed at the entrance and on the Blue Room door. We will also display what we will be learning each week in Blue Room and how you can help at home.

Your child will be allocated a keyworker who will help to ensure that your child's care is tailored to meet their individual needs and help the child become familiar with the setting. They offer a settled relationship for the child and build a relationship with their parents and carers. Then each term the keyworker will discuss with you your child's play, interests, progress and next steps in their learning. Please see the keyworker display located in the cloakroom in Blue Room.

Personal, social and emotional development  Physical	Confidently talk to other children when playing and will communicate freely about own home and community.  Interested in others' play and start to join in. Literacy	Distinguish between marks they make  Hold books correctly, turn pages and look at books independently	Look at marks, signs and symbols in the environment and talk about what they represent.  Read with your child for a <b>minimum</b> of 10 minutes <b>every day</b> . You can borrow books from our Nursery library in the entrance. Please speak to a member of staff in Blue Group.
Mathematics	Learn numerals through our core story	Visit Cbeebies numtums http://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/watch/numtums-numtum1 Count that number of e.g. steps, cushions, spoons etc. at home.
Understanding the world	Observing growth and change over time. Looking at how a caterpillar changes into butterfly	Visit <a href="https://m.youtube.com/watch?v=LIwEjdO_TL8">https://m.youtube.com/watch?v=LIwEjdO_TL8</a> and see the caterpillar change to a butterfly. Plant seeds and watch them grow and change over time from seed to plant with leaves, petals, etc.
Expressive arts and design	Pretend one object represents another and use representation to communicate e.g rolling a long piece of play dough and saying it's a worm and Drawing a line and say that's a butterfly.	Make play dough at home and let your child create what they want. Show an in interest by encouraging them to talk about what they have created.  (Play dough recipe attached)
