Extending Children's Knowledge Following children's interests

Our planning will always change as we learn more about our children's interests. We will use their interests to create a learning environment which will excite and challenge them.

Growing and harvesting Apples

The children have shown lots of interest in the falling apples in our nursery garden. They have initially used them to explore rolling and have now moved on to using different containers to collect the apples. We will make apple recipes and will learn about different types of apples and how



they grow. We will introduce our new giant weighing scales in the garden area to introduce the concept of weight and balance.

Water Play

The children have shown a lot of interest in water play and have been exploring water in different forms inside and outdoors. We will use our hands to splash and feel the water as well as adding



different objects such as small world animals and shells. To broaden this interest and develop learning further, we will introduce a wide variety of objects, tools and utensils for measuring, scooping, pouring, squeezing and containing. We will probably get wet!


Introducing New Knowledge and Skills. This is what we will teach the children

Our **Core Stories** help children to develop their listening skills. Children will become familiar with the books throughout the term and recite repeated phrases.

GREEN Room

Where's My Teddy?

This story introduces the language of size to describe the different bears as big/large, small/tiny and medium. We will focus on positional language, hiding bears and describing where to find them using language such as next to, under, beside, behind and in between. We will have the



opportunity to visit Ponderosa where we will use clues to find pictures of our "Class bear" Fraser. We will use the book to begin to explore our emotions.

ORANGE and PURPLE Room

Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do you See?

We will use Makaton signs and symbols, songs and rhymes to support our teaching of the sequence of the story, the names of the animals and colours. We will use a wide variety of visual props and sensory resources to support matching and sequencing.



New Routines

Throughout our group times, planned activities and playing together we will focus on your child's wellbeing as they settle in and form relationships with us and each other.

We will encourage your child to be independent with things like their coat and bag. We will support children to tidy up after they have finished playing and teach them how to

handle the resources with care.

Things you can do to support your child's learning

50 things activities are low cost activities to do as a family that will support your child's communication skills and confidence.



We will share one activity each week that you can do at home to support your child's learning.
